I'm half way to a hospital in St Pete for a baby's discharge from the CVICU unit where she had been for two months. She was going home to her new forever family (photo at left). Yes, God was working, but in more ways than we knew.

I got a call and a reminder that God works through CFS, even if we are unaware.

The call was from the social worker at a hospital in Tallahassee. A woman delivered a baby that morning and wanted to leave the hospital that evening. This new mom tested positive for drugs. She made it clear to the social worker that she wanted to place the baby for adoption. The social worker asked if CFS could meet with the mom before 6pm.

There was no way that I could be at both hospitals at the same time!

Debbie and Donna quickly made plans and arrived in Tallahassee. Debbie was able to present God's hope to this mom, for herself, and for her newborn baby. Instead of leaving that day, she was able to heal in the hospital for two days (Debbie is shown with the baby, lower right).

This hospital social worker contacted CFS from prior experience. She was confident that she could depend on CFS; that we would have potential families ready and waiting for this baby, even a baby who was born drug dependent.

YOU are CFS. Through your prayers and financial support, you enable counselors to give God's hope to women and their newborn babies. Like this mom, we meet some for the first time at the hospital.

YOU made it possible for CFS to respond to her request for an adoption plan! YOU blessed this young woman, her beautiful daughter, and the thrilled new adoptive family.



"Do you have a connection to adoption?"




New Website and Social Media
