"Carrie wants a family with pets!" Kim shared this important detail with CFS staff when she returned to the office.

Kim had been meeting with Carrie for several weeks. She was an expectant mom, working and raising a daughter. After Kim got to know Carrie and understood her reasons for wanting to place her baby for adoption, it was time to show Carrie profiles of adoptive families. While reviewing profiles, Carrie asked Kim if any of the families had pets. Usually a family shares such information in their book and one did have pets. We needed to know if the others had added a pet to their family since we received their book. Giving an expectant mom her choice of families is one way CFS Caseworkers meet the needs of expectant moms.

Once a woman makes an adoption plan for her baby, CFS caseworkers provide support to her in several ways. CFS Caseworkers meet regularly with clients to discuss options for their pregnancy. Some women make adoption plans and discover they have the ability to raise the child on their own, others discover family support during the pregnancy, and some recognize either they cannot raise the child on their own or believe their child would be better raised by an adoptive couple. Discussing parenting, or an alternative parenting plan, such as adoption, gives insight to the client and the CFS Caseworker. A client who wants to parent, even though she has made an adoption plan, can always change her mind. CFS Caseworkers can help her explore available community resources. Clients who have throughly explored their options and determined that adoption is the best choice for their baby are more likely to follow through with placement.

Food, transportation, a place to live and a phone that works are several other ways the needs of a CFS expectant mom are met. CFS Caseworkers discuss such needs with clients who have made an adoption plan for their baby. What are reasonable expectations to

meet such needs in north Florida? Prices have increased across the board. Rent for expectant women who are looking for housing have skyrocketed this past year!! You have probably experienced food and fuel increases for your own needs, imagine what it is like facing these expenses without guaranteed employment? This is what CFS expectant moms face. Assisting moms with these fundamental needs during and shortly after their pregnancy help them to get back on their feet financially after placement. It also shows them the love of Christ, who met the basic needs of many who followed Him during His ministry.

And so we return to Carrie following her meeting with Kim. Was there a CFS waiting family with pets? As you probably already guessed, there were several! Carrie chose a couple with a variety of pets. Kim arranged a meeting between Carrie and the prospective adoptive family. This mom and adoptive couple shared their mutual enjoyment of animals. Then, they discussed their hopes and dreams for the child Carrie would place for adoption.

Will you give \$50 to help educate and train adoptive families for moms like Carrie? A SAFE HAVEN FOR NEWBORNS:


The Safe Haven Law is a safety net that allows parents to leave their unharmed newborns, not more than a week old, at any Safe Haven facility recognized by state law, anonymously and without fear of prosecution.

It is dedicated to saving the precious lives of newborns from the dangers of abandonment and assisting pregnant girls and women in crisis. It has a 24/7 confidential and multilingual helpline. They have assisted more than 6000 mothers in need at no cost, and 371 Safe Haven babies and their new forever families. Christian Family Services has placed several Safe Haven babies for adoption into loving Christian homes.

Gloria Hope was the very first A Safe Haven for Newborns baby. Today, she is a college sophomore, and serves as an ambassador for the organization that saved her life. She shares an excerpt of a letter her birth mother wrote at her birth:

"My Dearest, The first thing I know you are wondering is Why? Why? Because I love you. It might sound strange at first, but this is true. Darling, I want to give you the World but I can't so I'm hoping by doing this – placing you in Safe Haven you will be given the world. You see I myself was adopted at birth. Ever since I was little, I've known I was adopted and dearly loved. The moment you were placed in my arms I fell in love with you. I am so thankful to the team at A Safe Haven for Newborns. I had called them for help and guidance. They were so kind and non-judgmental. I have loved you my little one since I found out you were in my tummy and I will love you forever."
